You should only use iChalk to make this project. There are no duration or resolution requirements, though you should give yourself enough room to adequately explore the possibilities.

To hand in your final movie file, follow these steps carefully:

- Name your final digital movie file unambiguously (perry 1.mov)
- Go to the Finder, and from the main menu select Go->Connect to Server (apple-k)
- Type in "urza" and connect using login cs198, password 198cs
- Choose to mount the volume named "cs198"
- Drag and drop your movie file into the folder on urza named "handin"
